CURRENT SITUATION & FUTURE EVENTS

It would be premature to suggest that complete normality has returned to Hong Kong or, indeed, anywhere for that matter. But hopefully there is some light at the end of the tunnel and that the situation is improving – albeit slowly. As I'm sure all are aware, the Government has relaxed the rules regarding the numbers participating in public gatherings and it is with this relaxation in mind that the Branch committee has decided to go ahead with an event in July.

This will be a combined visit to Stanley Military Cemetery, followed by a social gathering in Stanley village. The cemetery is the final resting place of no fewer than 5 holders of the George Cross, which ranks alongside the Victoria Cross as the highest gallantry award in the British Commonwealth. The opportunity will also be taken during the visit to look at some other graves of interest in the cemetery of both military personnel and civilians buried there.
